This year's study, Living the Kin-dom by Riva Tabelisma gives fresh eyes to the Lord's Prayer. Often learned by rote, the Lord's Prayer is a rich guide for how we can live out God's plan for our lives. Tabelisma invites participants in this study to step away from our automatic recitation of the prayer and dive deep into the meaning of each line over the course of eight one-hour sessions. Each of the sessions examines a section of the Lord's Prayer from Matthew 6:9–13.

Our wonderful study leaders from last year, Marty Cash-Burless and Linda Elms are returning this year. They each got rave reviews last year, and I'm sure this year will be the same.

Of course, it won't be Mission u if we don't spend time together eating ice cream, visiting, worshiping, watching a movie, and doing mission work.

United Women in Faith Texas Legislative Event 2023

This year's legislative event stands out for me from all others I've attended. There were more in-person attendees than before, even with the virtual option. (We were at capacity.) Critically important issues like gun violence, school vouchers, abortion, immigration, methane reduction, women's healthcare, voting rights, climate impacts, and LBGT rights made up the workshops and issue sessions. This is the first time I can recall the actual naming "abortion" as a topic; however, since abortion was and is the subject of bills being written by our state leaders, how could it not be included. Personally, I am proud to be among women who have the courage to tackle these contentious and life-altering public policy topics as followers of Christ.

The most dramatic difference in this year's Legislative Event had to do with the legislative priorities chosen by the attendees. This year, instead of whittling policy issues down to five on which to focus, there are twelve. Six statements support certain policy actions, and six statements oppose other policy actions. This is a more complete representation of the important justice issues facing our state and more clearly states what is important to Texas United Women in Faith.

What's Happening at Amarillo Wesley Community Center?

- Remodeling and construction at the new South Campus (site of the former Kingswood United Methodist Church) continues. To make the site compliant with all safety and security codes, as well as ADA regulations, the kitchen area, restrooms, and security systems have been completely updated. Thanks to several generous donors the project is nearing completion. As the AWCC Executive Director, Dr. Liz Rascon-Alaniz, says, "We can finally see the light at the end of the tunnel." The Amarillo Wesley staff is working to get many final requirements finished, such as code inspections and completing the Texas Childcare Licensing requirements for the new campus. Current plans are to begin services on the South Campus in late April or early May. Several services that are currently housed at the Main Campus in east Amarillo will be moving to the South Campus as soon as possible.
- Two vans have recently been donated to the Amarillo Wesley for use in their various programs and ministries. One van was donated from the City of Amarillo and Potter County using funds from ARPA, the American Rescue Plan Act. The other van was donated by the Bivins Foundation of Amarillo.
- On April 29, 2023, the AWCC will host the Jim Waterfield Memorial Golf Tournament (Palo Duro Creek Golf Course). The golf tournament is an annual fund-raising event sponsored by the community center.
- Una Gran Cena 2023 will be held in September. More information (date, place, speakers) will be available later. Una Gran Cena is another annual fund-raising event that helps ensure that the ministry of Amarillo Wesley Community Center will continue to serve as it has for more than seventy years.

SUPPORT

- Medicaid expansion under the Affordable Care Act
- 12-month postpartum Medicaid eligibility
- Women's access to and choice in all aspects of reproductive health care
- Strategies to encourage voter participation
- Science-based climate change mitigation, response, and adaptation
- Including more public voices at the Public Utility Commission

OPPOSE

- School vouchers or any other use of public funds to support private education
- New requirements or restrictions on voters or election administrators
- State funding for border militarization or anti-immigrant law enforcements
- Policies that constrain new renewable energy development
- Policies that give preference to a particular religious belief
- Policies that lead to persecution on the basis of race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity, or faith

(These policy positions fall within the umbrella of the National United Women In Faith advocacy emphases of Climate Justice and Racial Justice.)
